From the earliest centuries the Fourth Gospel has accompanied the Church through Lent and Eastertide, and the reading of its Passion has been central to Good Friday. Eastertide then, is the perfect moment to enter into the text of what is for many Christians the summit of the Gospel tradition: a work that soars to the heights like an eagle.

St John's Gospel captures our attention through very simple words and concrete imagery: bread, water, flesh. Yet we struggle to understand its layers of meaning and shifting conversations. The text is so rich and deep. We are drawn into the profound realities of life, death and love through signs and symbols. And we are led to adore Christ, risen, exalted, glorified and say with Thomas *'My Lord and my God.'*

There is no better person than Dom Henry Wansbrough to guide us through the text and help us grasp its meaning on this study weekend. Who wrote this extraordinary Gospel? How did it come into being? And how might we appropriate its *'message of eternal life.'*

Dom Henry was General Editor of the New Jerusalem Bible and served as a member of the Pontifical Biblical Commission. Above all he is a great teacher. Dom Henry is a monk of Ampleforth Abbey.
